Amanda is from Malmö, Sweden, studying a Bachelor of Health Science (Health Communication)

I began working as an intern for the Head of Social Media and Communication at a company called Food Matters. foodmatters.com

Food Matters was started by a couple, James and Laurentine, who were looking to find a way to help heal James' sick Dad. On their journey of researching and discovery they found a lot of interesting information, but James' Dad was not interested in the books and research they sent him. This led them to create Food Matters a documentary where they interviewed doctors, scientists, nutritionists and health professionals from all over the world. They showed James' Dad the footage and he got hooked.

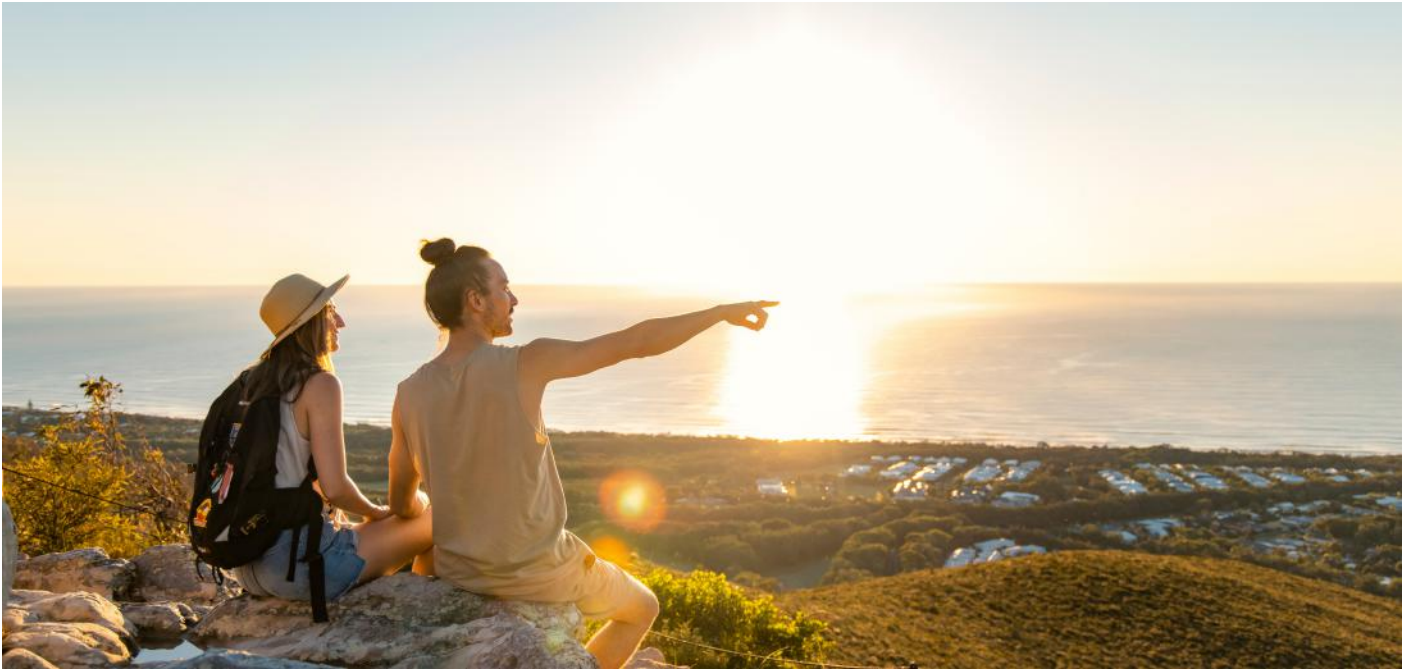
After a couple of months of having changed his diet and slowly getting him off his medications, even against the protests from his doctors, he was back to his former healthy self. They decided to share Food Matters with the rest of the world and it has now been seen by millions. They went on to create another documentary called Hungry For Change, launch a health and wellness version of Netflix called FMTV and of course launched the Food Matters webpage where they share daily healthy recipes, articles, videos and quotes.

Being a health communications student and a bit of a Food Matters fan, I was super excited and of course extremely nervous when getting the opportunity to start an internship there. So what does a normal day look like at Food Matters?

Arriving bright and early at 9am I am greeted by a light, sunshine filled office and several of the happy Food Matters team members. Many are already sitting at their desks working away, whilst some newly arrived are chatting with their colleagues in the Food Matters kitchen whilst making their breakfast smoothie. I have a chat with my supervisor about what is on today's agenda. A bit later on James arrives at the office with a big smile on his face. He makes his way around the office where he greets and hugs everyone before he heads over to his own desk.

After lunch, it is back to work and maybe a tea break... Or two. The office has a great selection of tea (I have tried them all) and coffee. By 5 o'clock people are slowly starting to pack up and head home or maybe to a yoga class.

I recently finished my internship at Food Matters after being there for around three and a half months. All I can say is that it was a great experience and there are so many amazing people working at the office trying to help people live healthier and happier lives. Food Matters is truly a company which the world needs from providing education in the form of documentaries to healthy recipes, articles and videos.



FUTURE CAREERS

With the economic growth and development planned for the region over the next 20 plus years and the ongoing population growth on the Sunshine Coast, there will be more employment opportunities across a number of sectors. Future Careers on the Sunshine Coast include:

HEALTH & WELLBEING

Whether your interest is following a medical path, preventative health or aged care, all careers in the health and wellbeing industry are important. With an ever-growing and ageing population there will be an increasing demand for health services and many Sunshine Coast students will have the opportunity to pursue a sustainable career.

The health and wellbeing industry is the largest employer in the region, with the latest figures showing 1,700 healthcare businesses employing around 21,000 people. The industry is expected to double its employment numbers by 2033.

EDUCATION & RESEARCH

The Australian education industry is undergoing a transition on a national scale to put greater focus on science, technology, engineering and mathematics, otherwise known as STEM subjects.

Almost \$65 million has been allocated for 10 initiatives under the Inspiring all Australians in Digital Literacy and STEM program as part of the National Innovation and Science Agenda. The scope for future careers in teaching is ever expanding. Future teachers will be required to have STEM skills providing for 75 per cent of jobs in the fastest growing industries over the next five to 10 years.

TOURISM, SPORT & LEISURE

The Sunshine Coast tourism industry is one of the key drivers of the economy. It provides more than 16,200 direct and indirect tourism jobs.

Growth in this industry in Australia is projected to stem from a modest increase in leisure tourism as well as in education tourism and medical tourism. On the Sunshine Coast, a growth in tourism translates to a growth in almost all industries as tourists consume a diverse range of products and services and tourism operators draw on a wide range of industries to deliver their products and services. The local industry is expected to provide jobs for more than 21,000 people by 2024.

AVIATION AND AEROSPACE

The Sunshine Coast is home to a diverse aviation industry encompassing domestic and international travel, pilot training, education, manufacturing, engineering, design, charter services, emergency services and maintenance.

The aviation and aerospace industry is set to almost double by 2025 as population growth places higher demand on the current airports.

AGRIBUSINESS

The agribusiness industry on the Sunshine Coast is home to more than 800 small and medium-sized niche businesses and comprises primary producers, processors, food manufacturers, growers, farmers and nurseries, agri-tourism and local food networks.

Advances in technology will create employment opportunities for experts in digital, robotics, drones, agricultural machinery, repair and maintenance, food technology, nutrition and innovation. Businesses will continue to seek staff who can improve efficiencies and logistics and develop their products through food technology and design led principles.



IT

With so many game changer projects on the Sunshine Coast, the digital economy is poised to continue to expand and increase employment opportunities. The nature of technology means skills learned in knowledge and professional services can be easily transferred to other fields. All workplaces use, or could use, computers, mobiles, tablets, wearables and other technologies and so have the capacity to look out for innovative and creative individuals with skills in advanced technology solutions.

CLEAN TECHNOLOGIES

The region has already been recognised as a hub for clean technology businesses and aligns with Sunshine Coast Council's vision to be Australia's most sustainable region – healthy, smart, creative. The clean tech industry includes a host of businesses that create new technologies in order to benefit the environment and boost business productivity and efficiency.

The sector consists of four main areas, including water, waste, energy and the built environment. On the Sunshine Coast, clean tech businesses strive to provide continuous improvement to people, the planet and profits.

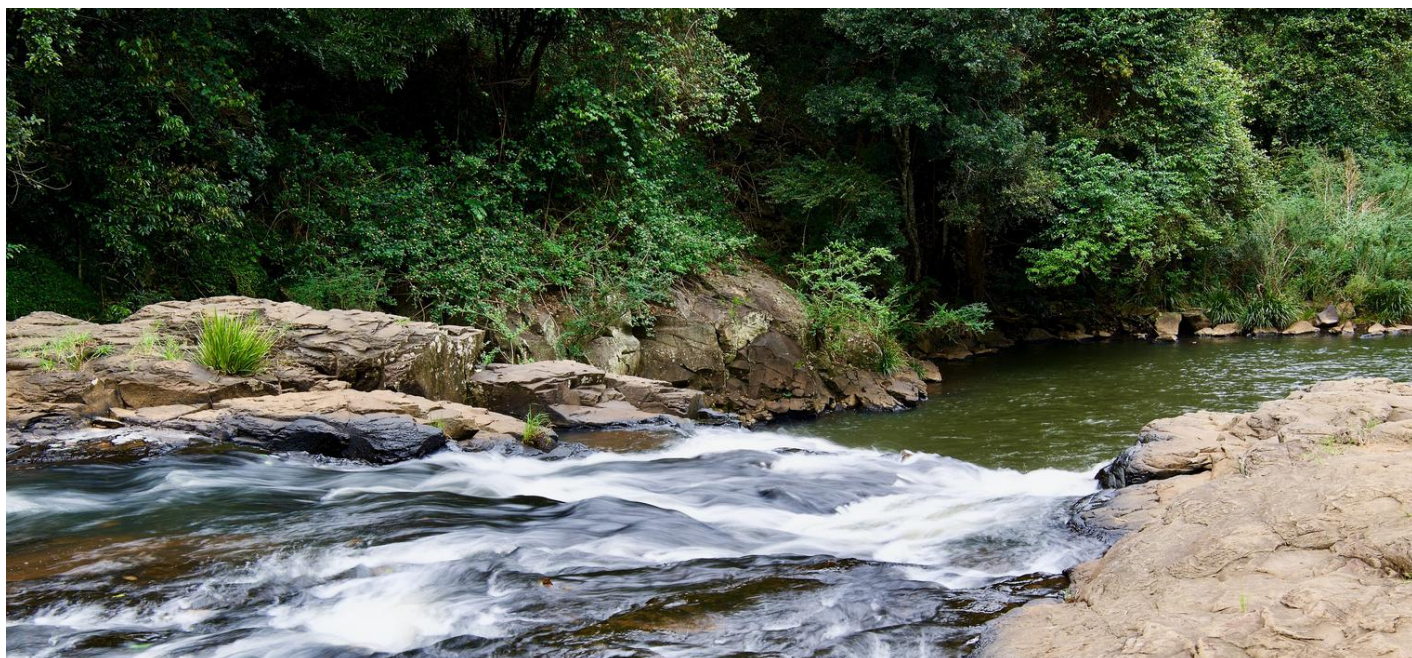
SUNSHINE COAST BEACHES
